### **Guest Speaker/Facilitator: Norm Taylor, Global Network for Community Safety**

Norm has practiced for over 35 years as an independent consultant, educator, researcher, author and moderator. His practice has been concentrated almost exclusively on policing, public safety and criminal justice concerns, at both the policy and operational levels, in Canada and abroad for the past 20 years. Since 2008, while continuing his general practice nationally, Norm has served as the Future of Policing Consultant to the Province of Saskatchewan, and since 2012 he has served as a Senior Advisor to that province's Deputy Minister of Justice: Corrections and Policing. His 2010 report to the provincial cabinet set the stage for a collaborative, whole-of-government approach to community safety and well-being that has since drawn national and international attention for its effectiveness at reducing crime and yielding improvements across a wide range of other social indicators. More recently, many communities in the Province of Ontario have begun to emulate the Saskatchewan models, and Norm and his growing team of associates have been supporting those efforts as well. He now also serves as a Special Advisor to the Deputy Minister of Community Safety in that province.
